


Holocaust Memorial: RECOMMENDED READING Year 7

As he waits desperately for news from home, he fears that Mordecai and Leo – the closest thing to family he has left – will move on without him. 
Anne Frank: the diary of a young girl

A deeply moving and unforgettable portrait of an ordinary and yet an extraordinary teenage girl.

First published over sixty years ago, Anne Frank's *Diary of a Young Girl* has reached millions of young people throughout the world.

In July 1942, thirteen-year-old Anne Frank and her family, fleeing the occupation, went into hiding in an Amsterdam warehouse. Over the next two years Anne vividly describes in her diary the frustrations of living in such close quarters, and her thoughts, feelings and longings as she grows up. Her diary ends abruptly when, in August 1944, they were all betrayed.

Since its publication in 1947, *The Diary of a Young Girl* has been read by tens of millions of people.

The Hidden Village:

75 years ago: Wartime Holland. Who can you trust?

Deep in the Veluwe woods lies a secret that frustrates the Germans. Convinced that Jews are hiding close by, they can find no proof.

The secret is Berkenhout, a purpose-built village of huts sheltering dozens of Jews and others evading capture by the Nazis. Among them is Sofie, a young Jewish girl, separated from family and friends, whose rebelliousness has catastrophic consequences.

Henk Hauer, the respected head woodman, is in charge of building the underground huts and ensuring everyone stays safe.

But is Henk everything he claims to be? Suspicions grow of his dangerous dealings with the Germans.
